
SURVEY OF ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS AND KINDERGARTEN CHILDREN

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- To understand the emotional state of children (and their parents/guardians) living in Fukushima following the Great East Japan Earthquake. The focus will be on psychological stress.
- To clarify how the psychological stress of the Fukushima children and their parents/guardians is changing with the passage of time.
- To estimate the level of stress linked to the natural disaster and the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear disaster, by making comparisons with children from other prefectures.





Question items

 \bullet Parents' anxiety about radiation (9 items) Original questionnaire Three-point scale: "Always...as I used to," "sometimes,""Have stopped doing it." Parents' stress (8 items) Created based on the stress scale developed by Takata et al. (1999) Four-point scale: from "Often" to "Never" Children's stress (19 items) Created by referring to the Parent Report of the Child's Reaction Stress, by Fletcher (1996) Four-point scale: from "Often" to "Never"

Parents' anxiety about radiation (9 items)

- Q1. Do you dry your wash outside?
- Q2. Do you use a ventilating fan?
- Q3. Do you open a window to ventilate your room?
- Q4. Do you let your child drink tap water?
- Q5. Do you make your child wear a mask when he/she goes out?
- Q6. Do you let your child play outside?
- Q7. Do you check environmental dose rates?
- Q8. Have you studied about radiation effects?
- Q9. Do you buy vegetables from Fukushima?

Parents' stress (8 items)

- Q1. Do you get irritated or get angry quickly?
- Q2. Do you jump at sounds?
- Q3. Do you feel down?
- Q4. Do you have difficulty concentrating on your daily work?
- Q5. Do you suddenly remember about the earthquake?
- Q6. Do you have little appetite or are you unable to control your appetite?
- Q7. Do you get tired easily or feel weak?
- Q8. Do you have difficulty falling asleep or wake up during the night?

Depression (9 items)

- Continues to have poor appetite
- Gets confused after remembering something
- Gets tongue-tied and dislikes talking
- Has little interest in new activities that other children are willing to join in
- Shows regression after the earthquake disaster
- Plays something related to a specific event (such as the disaster)
- Suppresses his/her feelings
- Blames himself/herself for a specific event (such as the disaster)
- Complains of a stomachache, headache, nausea or weariness
- when something reminds him/her of an event (such as the disaster)

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Insecurity (4 items)

- Gets terrified when something happens
- Afraid that a specific event (such as a disaster) will occur again
- Jumps at sudden sounds
- Talks repeatedly about a specific event (such as the disaster)

Regression (4 items)


- Follows an adult around (never strays far from his/her guardian)
- Looks lonely and all alone
- Dislikes being alone
- (dislikes going to kindergarten or school, or follows you to the toilet or bath)
- Has difficulty remembering about nasty events related to the disaster


Irritation (2 items)

Does not concentrate on study and play













Correlation between Parents' stress and Children's stress





- Having continuously studied the stress levels of Fukushima's primary school children, pre-school children, and their parents/guardians, it can be concluded that their anxiety about radiation is decreasing.
- Figures from 2011, 2012 and 2013 show that stress levels are also decreasing.
- However, compared to other prefectures, stress levels have been persistently high. It can be said that they are being exposed to ongoing stress.
