- To develop state policy measures in the field of national security and resilience
- To develop draft strategic and program documents
- To identify concerted action plans and protocols in case of response to threats, emergencies or crises of any origin at their different stages



Fundamentally important aspects

Development and implementation of a unified methodology for threat assessment

- Permanent formats of interaction at different levels





- Methodological shortcomings:
 - Threat assessment based on past experience
 - Subjectivity of assessment
 - Risk of data manipulation
 - High level of uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity of risks and threats
 - Lack of risk interdependency analysis
- Insufficient level of professionalism, lack and turnover of staff
- Incomplete threat assessment cycle
- Difficulties in integrating different databases and information systems, cyber- and information security, data management and storage
- Resource constraints
- Lack of political will to implement the system



- Ministries and agencies carry out threat assessments in their areas of responsibility, using their own methods, criteria and approaches
- The assessment results obtained in this way are difficult, and sometimes impossible, to compare. The interplay of threats and possible cascading effects are not taken into account. It is difficult to form a balanced state policy based on such results
- Comprehensive capability assessment is not conducted
- Interagency cooperation in this area and taking into account the results of scientific research are insufficient
- Available technical capabilities in the form of the Main Situation Center of Ukraine and the network of situation centers are not provided with adequate analytical content in terms of threat assessment and vulnerability detection



- Lack of unified methodology and techniques for national security threats assessment, evaluation of the relevant capabilities and identification of vulnerabilities necessary for the making strategic decisions
- Incomplete development of the national integrated strategic planning system
- Lack of a state body responsible for organization and coordination of the national security threats assessment and related capabilities
- Lack of universal protocols for concerted action in response to emergencies, threats and crises at different stages of their development
- Imperfect legal regulation of strategic planning and analysis, including national security threats assessment and evaluation of relevant capabilities
